# Welcome to Chiba


Just east of Tokyo, Chiba Prefecture is a blend of urban sophistication and serene natural beauty. Stretching across the Boso Peninsula, Chiba's eastern and southern coasts are embraced by the Pacific Ocean, while its western shores hug the edges of Tokyo Bay. With its rich cultural tapestry and stunning natural landscapes, Chiba offers an array of experiences waiting to be discovered.




# Discover Narita: A Gatewayn to Tradition and Culture

# Naritasan Shinsho-ji Temple

Just a short train ride from Narita International Airport, Narita offers a perfect introduction to Japan's rich cultural heritage. The historic district is easily accessible and makes an ideal stop to begin or conclude your Japanese journey. Narita International Airport, with its three terminals, ensures smooth travel connections to this fascinating city.

At the heart of Narita is the Naritasan Shinsho-ji Temple, with a history spanning over 1,000 years. 






Located about 30 minutes from Narita, Sawara is renowned for its well-preserved Edo-period charm. The town's historic streets, lined with traditional buildings and ancient shops, evoke a bygone era. In the heart of Sawara, a stroll along the Ono River offers a tranquil boat ride through scenic waterways that once fueled the town's prosperity. Just a bit farther, Suigo Sawara Ayame Park dazzles with its seasonal iris blossoms, providing a beautiful escape into nature. Additionally, Sawara's rich history as a commercial hub is celebrated by the home of Ino Tadataka, the renowned mapmaker whose accomplishments are deeply rooted in the town.





# Narita Gion Festival

The Narita Gion Festival features ten decorated dashi floats and a portable mikoshi shrine paraded through the charming Naritasan Omotesando approach and surrounding area. With over 300 years of history, this festival's music, dance, and illuminated floats bring a lively and nostalgic atmosphere to the city.

The Sawara Grand Festival, celebrated twice a year, show-cases wooden floats with massive, intricately carved historical figures. Originating nearly 300 years ago, this event honors Sawara's commercial legacy with a parade through the town, accompanied by traditional music and elaborate float displays.





# Katsuura Big Hina Matsuri (Doll Festival)

The Katsuura Big Hina Matsuri transforms Tomisaki Shrine with about 1,800 decorative dolls on its vermillion staircase. This vibrant display is part of the Hina Matsuri Doll Festival and celebrates the arrival of spring and prays for the health of young girls.

# Ohara Hadaka Festival




This is a festival that is held to pray for a good harvest and a large catch of fish, during which 19 portable mikoshi shrines are carried through the town and down to the sea. The highlight is the exhilarating "Shiofumi" ritual, where mikoshis are carried into the sea, moving with dynamic energy and creating an impressive spectacle.





# Mount Nokogiri

To reach Mount Nokogiri, you can start your journey from Hamakanaya Station on the JR Uchibo Line or the nearby Tokyo Bay Ferry terminal at Kanaya Port. The ferry ride itself is a scenic experience, offering lovely views of the bay and the surrounding coastline. Once you arrive, you can embark on a variety of hiking trails that cater to different skill levels. There is also a ropeway that can take you to the top of the mountain. The well-maintained paths lead you through lush forests and past historical sites, including the famous Hyaku-shaku Kannon statue and the Daibutsu (Great Buddha statue) carved directly into the mountain's rock face.

# Kominato Railway A Journey Through Time

Start your adventure on the Kominato Railway, a nostalgic ride from Ichihara City to Otaki Town. This diesel-powered line, dating back to the early 20th century, provides a glimpse into Chiba's past with its vintage train cars and untouched wooden stations. As you travel, admire the picturesque rural landscapes, including fields of vibrant nanohana mustard flowers and the seasonal beauty of cherry blossoms. The Kominato Railway's route also features the historic Kazusa-Tsurumai Station, preserved from the 1930s, and offers family-fun experiences such as the torokko railcar (limited availability), an open-window train for a thrilling ride through the countryside. With an allday pass, you can hop on and off to explore various stations and scenic spots.











Some facilities may restrict guests with tattoos, so please confirm onsite as policies vary. However, tattoos are permitted in private or in-room baths.




